### *How Our Record Is Calculated*

Baseball is really pretty simple. We want our players to put the same amount of money on every game, regardless of the money line. If you're a \$100 player, then you play \$100 on each game we put out and you let us manage the amount you're risking against the line. We rarely make straight plays on games that are above -\$160 and we play dogs on a regular basis. At the end of the season, our average play against the money line is usually around -\$120. In fact, as you can see from our Five Year Average, it was -\$124.

Money Line averages are a little tricky, so make sure you pay more attention to the average play and the season totals than you do to percentages when you're talking to someone about season service. If your average play is -\$200, you have to maintain a 66% win rate just to break even.
